Busy Friday in Spanish class! We started earlier than normal this week. As I promised the students last week, I found an easy recipe of a popular traditional Mexican desert: **Arroz con Leche**, which translated means rice with milk, but it is a kind of rice pudding. A few students from Ms. Dionysia and Ms.

Alexandra's class started the process first thing in the morning, since the desert takes a few hours to make. They read and followed the recipe step by step, left it on the slow cooker and kept on checking it throughout the day; then they came back around their lunchtime to add the rest of the ingredients to complete the recipe. This delicious desert was ready by the time they had their class. The tasting results were two thumbs up from 99% of the students. It was really scrumptious. Some students asked for the recipe so they could make it at home, so here it is in case you want to try it yourself:

Students also practiced the song and its vocabulary by playing a "**matamoscas**"/ "flypaper" game, they'd have to find a word written on the white board, the team that crossed it out first would get a point. Students are very competitive, and this game creates a lot of suspense, excitement and even frustration. In class, we are learning to be respectful and we also practice our self-control when playing this kind of games.

Our oldest students also finished a listening exercise on an individual board. Instructions were read to them and they had to complete it as it was read to them. Vocabulary on this exercise included: colors, verbs, prepositions of position, and nouns related to Christmas. It was a great exercise.

Younger students also had a fun game to play. We talked about a very traditional dreidel game. Yes, Hispanics also have their own version of the famous Jewish dreidel, in Spanish of course. We call it **Pirinola**. The vocabulary on this game is very easy, and students learned it in a flash:

Toma 1/ take 1

Toma 2/ take 2

Toma todo/ take everything

Pon 1/ put 1

Pon 2/ put 2

Todos ponen/ everyone puts 1

While playing this game, we also learn to take turns, to respect, to be patient, help others, and also to win or lose gracefully.

And finally, our little ones kept practicing shapes, and enjoyed painting jingle bells made out of recycled egg cartons.

We continued practicing our song for the holiday program. Here are the lyrics and the link for the song:
