
Math: This week the students were solving equations with tape diagrams. The students were able to draw tape diagrams and sole equations to model problems about the New York Botanical Garden's Holiday Train Show exhibit, built by Applied Imagination. The article was fun and fit right in with our pre holiday program practice. The students learned that a tape diagram is a way to visualize a word problem. Each part of the tape diagram represents the number relationships identified in the word problem. This can be a great way for students to solves equations with unknown variables.

Exploration: Art: On Tuesday, the students started their art exploration! The students will be researching art movements from the 1776 (America's birth) to the present. Each group of students will be taking on the challenge of a certain decade and will be looking at the artists and type of art being created during their period. They will also be comparing the movements

between different continents during their time period! We will continue to work on this till break.

Novel Study: The students personal novel studies are going great! The students are doing a great job staying on schedule with their weekly readings as well as discussion questions. I am very proud of each of them for sharing their new information with their peers on our classroom window. Please feel free to stop in and check out each students notes.
